Title	Bylaw 1470/20 – Committee of the Whole Bylaw Review
lssue	Bylaw 1470/20, the Committee of the Whole Bylaw, requires that Administration bring the Bylaw forward to Council for review by March 1, 2022.
Proposed Motion(s)	That the Committee receive the Committee of the Whole Bylaw Review update as information.
Previous Council / Committee Direction	March 10, 2020 Regular Council Meeting Motion 113/20: That Council give third reading of Bylaw 1470/20.
Report	 Background Information At the May 14, 2019 Council Meeting, Council directed Administration to review the Council Committees structure and make recommendations on an expanded role for Committee of the Whole. At the November 12, 2019 Council Meeting, Administration recommended expansion of the scope and mandate of Committee of the Whole based on a jurisdictional scan of comparable municipalities. At the March 10, 2020 Council Meeting, Council passed Bylaw 1470/20 to establish Committee of the Whole as a Council Committee, with the mandate to: Provide strategic oversight of progress of Council's Strategic Plan and monitor Council-established priorities, ensuring that programs and services authorized by Council are consistent with Council's Strategic Plan and that strategic objectives are being met, and Support Council's decision-making process by providing a venue for fulsome discussion and debate on key principles, ideas, or components of projects, policies, plans, or other things that will ultimately require Council direction or decision. In order to fulfill its mandate, Council authorized Committee of the Whole to:

0	Make recommendations to Council regarding any reports, updates, or
	presentations received by the Committee,

- Monitor progress on Council priorities, strategic initiatives, master plans, major projects (capital or operating), and planning initiatives,
- $\circ~$ Receive presentations from the public and delegations, and
- Receive annual reports from Council Committees on Committee activities as required by the Council Committees Bylaw.

Committee Review

- To ensure that Committee of the Whole continues to meet Council's needs and continues to add value, section 11.1 of the Bylaw requires Administration to bring the Bylaw forward to Council for review by March 1, 2022, two years after the Bylaw was passed.
- Administration identifies that Committee of the Whole continues to add value to the County's overall governance structure. The opportunity for members of Council to have a less formal venue to receive information and updates from Administration and external groups and to discuss salient topics without the expectation of decision enriches the County's governance structure. Matters that require decision that are not within the Committee's mandate are presented to Council.
- Administration does not recommend that Bylaw 1470/20 be amended, and that Council receive this update as information, thereby acknowledging that, in its current form, the Committee is meeting Council's needs and expectations.
- Should Council seek amendments to Bylaw 1470/20 to change the purpose, mandate, membership, or structure of the Committee, a motion to that effect would be required and Administration would draft corresponding amendments for Council's future consideration.
