Briefing Note

Title	Bylaw 1471/20 – Governance and Council Services Committee Bylaw Review		
Issue	Bylaw 1471/20, the Governance and Council Services Committee Bylaw, requires that Administration bring the Bylaw forward to Council for review by March 1, 2022.		
Proposed Motion(s)	That the Committee receive the Governance and Council Services Committee Bylaw Review update as information.		
Previous Council / Committee Direction	March 10, 2020 Regular Council Meeting Motion 110/20: That Council give third reading of Bylaw 1471/20.		

Report Background Information

- At the May 14, 2019 Council Meeting, Council directed Administration to review the Council Committees structure and make recommendations to Council.
- At the March 10, 2020 Council Meeting, Council passed Bylaw 1471/20 to establish the Governance and Council Services Committee, with the mandate to:
 - Provide a venue for discussion and decision on operational and housekeeping matters related to Council and identified within Bylaw 1471/20.
 - Ensure that the mandates and terms of reference for Councilestablished Boards and Committees are reviewed to confirm alignment with Council's Strategic Plan and priorities as established by Council from time to time and to make recommendations to Council where adjustments may be required, and
 - Ensure Council's expectations of Council Committees are articulated to the Council Committees so that Council's vision for the Municipality can be achieved.
- In order to fulfill its mandate, Council authorized the Governance and Council Services Committee to:
 - Make decisions on the expenditure of Council common expenses, including public relations, sponsorships, conferences, conventions, and professional development funds, that are allocated to Council as a whole and not allocated to individual members of Council

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- through the annual budget process (individual allocations are not within the mandate of the Committee),
- Approve the process for conducting the annual County Commissioner performance evaluation,
- o Issue annual mandate letters to every other Council Committee,
- Receive updates from Administration and provide recommendations on matters of a governance nature, including draft bylaws and policies which will ultimately be presented to Council for consideration, and
- Approve Council professional development and orientation sessions that are scheduled for, and applicable to, all members of Council.

Committee Review

- To ensure that the Governance and Council Services Committee
 continues to meet Council's needs and continues to add value, section
 10.1 of the Bylaw requires Administration to bring the Bylaw forward to
 Council for review by March 1, 2022, two years after the Bylaw was
 passed.
- Administration identifies that the Governance and Council Services
 Committee continues to add value to the County's overall governance
 structure. Providing a venue for discussion and decision on operational
 and housekeeping matters and other matters within the Committee's
 jurisdiction enriches the County's governance structure. Matters that
 require decision that are not within the Committee's mandate are
 presented to Council.
- Administration does not recommend that Bylaw 1471/20 be amended, and that Council receive this update as information, thereby acknowledging that, in its current form, the Committee is meeting Council's needs and expectations.
- Should Council seek amendments to Bylaw 1471/20 to change the purpose, mandate, membership, or structure of the Committee, a motion to that effect would be required and Administration would draft corresponding amendments for Council's future consideration.
