	The Fort Augustus Park Subdivision Rehabilitation project includes 1.07 kilometers of road rehabilitation within the subdivision. The work will consist of pulverizing, salvaging, hauling, placing/compacting existing granular material, and surfacing the road with a new asphalt structure.

	• Tenders for the Fort Augustus Park Subdivision Rehabilitation project were advertised on Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC) on January 6, 2022. The tender period closed on January 27, 2022.		
	 Eleven (11) tenders were received, ranging from \$959,500 to \$1,415,949.49 (excluding GST). 		
	• The tenders were reviewed, and it is recommended that Sturgeon County award the contract for the Fort Augustus Park Subdivision Rehabilitation project to DeFord Contracting Inc. as they were the lowest compliant bidder.
