# Request for Decision

Title	Council COVID-19 Policy
<b>Proposed Motion</b>	That Council approve the amended Council COVID-19 Policy as presented.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council amend the Council COVID-19 Policy to align with the Government of Alberta's 3-step plan to phase out COVID-19 public health measures announced on February 8, 2022.

Report	<ul> <li>At the January 25, 2022 Council meeting, Council approved the Council COVID-19 Policy, which includes the following provisions:         <ul> <li>The requirement to not attend any Sturgeon County work site if the Councillor has tested positive for COVID-19 or is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.</li> <li>The requirement to wear face coverings at all times while in an indoor, enclosed, or substantially enclosed County work site unless an exemption is warranted, or an exception is applicable in accordance with the provisions of the Policy.</li> <li>The requirement for Councillors to provide proof that they are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or participate in rapid testing in accordance with the provisions of the Policy.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The isolation and face coverings requirements of the Policy came into effect on January 25 and the vaccination/rapid test requirements came into effect on January 31, 2022.</li> <li>On February 8, 2022, the Government of Alberta announced a 3-step plan to phase out COVID-19 public health measures. Matters relevant to Sturgeon County include:         <ul> <li>Step 1 – Effective February 9, 2022 – Removal of Restrictions Exemption Program (REP), along with associated restrictions.</li> <li>Step 2 – Effective March 1, 2022, if hospitalization are trending downwards – Mandatory work-from-home requirements lifted; indoor masking no longer required.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

- Step 3 Timeline to be determined based on hospitalization rates –
   Mandatory isolation removed (becomes a recommendation only).
- In response to the enactment of Step 1 of the Government of Alberta's
  plan, Administration recommends that the requirement for Councillors to
  provide proof of vaccination or participate in rapid testing be rescinded,
  effective immediately. This would align with the recission of Sturgeon
  County's Employee COVID-19 Vaccination Directive and Visitor COVID-19
  Vaccination Directive on February 9, 2022.
- Administration recommends that face covering requirements be rescinded in alignment with the lifting of provincial indoor masking requirements. This could be as early as March 1, 2022, pending hospitalization rates.
- As mandatory isolation requirements will not be addressed until Step 3, Administration recommends that the requirement for Councillors to not attend any County work site after testing positive for COVID-19 or exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms remain in effect until Step 3 is enacted.
