- **Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board Metropolitan Region Servicing Plan (MRSP) Standing Committee** – Sturgeon County is required to appoint an alternate member to the Committee. Mayor Hnatiw has recommended that she be appointed as the alternate as she is the EMRB Council representative.
- o Edmonton Region Waste Advisory Committee (ERWAC) -Sturgeon County is required to appoint an alternate member to the Committee. Mayor Hnatiw has recommended that Councillor Stang be appointed as the alternate.
- o Sturgeon Victim Services Members of Council have been invited to become members and attend Sturgeon Victim Services meetings. Rather than all members of Council becoming members and attending meeting, it is recommended that Council appoint a Council representative to liaise with Sturgeon Victim Services. Mayor Hnatiw has recommended that Councillor Stang be appointed, with Councillor Berry as alternate.
