# Request for Decision

Title	Revised 2023 Operating and Capital Budget Meeting Dates
Proposed Motion	That Council revise the 2023 Operating and Capital Budget Meeting dates from November 16-18, 2022, to October 27-28, 2022 and November 23-24, 2022.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council revise the 2023 Operating and Capital Budget Meeting dates to allow for process amendments and sufficient time between Council's proposed budget presentations and deliberations. Adjusting the dates considers the time needed between each stage in the budget process, allowing Administration to incorporate priorities proposed by Council for consideration.

	<ul> <li>At the October 26, 2021 Organizational Council Meeting, the 2023         Operating and Capital Budget Meeting was scheduled for November 16-18, 2022.     </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>For the 2023 Budget, Administration is planning strategic Council Budget sessions in April and September 2022 to drive out priorities. It is also proposed that Council Budget Requests be facilitated in the period between these sessions.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>On October 27 and 28, 2022, the Leadership Team will deliver proposed budget presentations pertaining to operating, capital, and enhancements for consideration.</li> </ul>
	Between October 29, 2022 and November 22, 2022, Council will have time to consider the presentations and prepare for budget deliberations.

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- On November 23 and 24, 2022, Council deliberations will take place and provide Administration direction for consolidation.
- Following Council deliberations, Financial Services will work to complete any adjustments made by Council through motion and bring the Consolidated 2023 Budget for Council approval on December 13, 2022.

   Administration to adjust the 2023 Budget Plan to ensure milestones are
   still considered and that budget approval occurs by December 13, 2022.
