Proposed Motion	That Council award the contract for the 2022 Pavement Preservation - Micro-Surfacing Program contract to West-Can Seal Coating Inc. at a contract price of \$1,478,377.12 (excluding GST) and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the contract.

	5. Range Road 223 (Boysdale Road to Sturgeon Road) – 0.8 kilometres
	6. Noroncal (Crozier Avenue) – 0.67 kilometres
	7. Aspen Ridge (Aspenridge Crescent) – 0.46 kilometres
	8. Rosal Acres (Bell Bay, Bow Bay and Salmon Drive) – 1.8 kilometres

### Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

**Procurement Policy** 

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the Alberta Purchasing Connection.
- Purchases exceeding \$500,000 are to be ratified at the following Council Meeting.
- The Chief Administrative Officer shall be signing authority for all Construction or Capital contracts over \$500,000.

# Implication of Administrative Recommendation

### **Strategic Alignment:**

**Planned Growth** – The awarding of this contract is consistent with: *Reliable* and effective infrastructure.

**Operational Excellence** – The awarding of this contract is consistent with: *Quality cost-effective service delivery; asset management and performance measurement.* 

### Organizational:

 The awarding of this contract will reduce the maintenance requirements of this road segment thereby freeing up additional capacity to maintain Sturgeon County's service commitment to operational excellence.

### Financial:

 The estimated total cost to complete the 2022 Pavement Preservation (Micro Surfacing) is \$1,626,214.12. There is currently \$3,072,000.00 in available funds.

### Financial:

 Not awarding this contract would only temporarily defer the required capital renewal cost for this asset.
