Proposed Motion	That Council accept the Open Space Plan (2022) Review and Update as an appendix document to the Open Space Plan (2016) and adopt four of the stated policies to be implemented over the next five years.				
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council accept the Open Space Plan (OSP) (2022) Review and Update as an appendix to the Open Space Plan (2016) as information and adopt the following four recommendations as Policies to be implemented over the next five years:				
	 Sturgeon County create development guidelines and policy that includes principles of biodiversity and low-impact development to help prioritize the protection of the natural environment. 				
	2. Ensure there is a cross-section of open space initiatives and acquisitions that are representative of the diversity of open spaces identified in the inventory.				
	 Support the environmental conservation, protection, and enhancement of County-owned open space for present and future generations. 				
	4. Prioritize open space projects based on the principles of:				
	 a. strategic value (Plan alignment, regulatory, safety, life-cycle maintenance, cost efficiency, and multi-year capital plan sequencing); b. environmental ethic; c. community well-being and leading practice; and d. contributing to a <i>sense of place</i> (identity, history, culture, and design).

Report	 Background Information The purpose of the Open Space Plan (OSP) approved in 2016 is to guide the acquisition, development, and disposition of open spaces in the County. It provides specific guidance regarding the development of assets within the open space system and site-specific capital improvements. 				
	 At the May 11, 2021 Council meeting, Sturgeon County's open space vision was described as "to protect, preserve, and promote the County' beautiful and surprising natural spaces". 				
	• The development and effective management of open space is critical to community well-being and helps maintain and enhance strong communities and a sense of belonging, pride, and connection				
	• COVID-19 highlighted the value and need for passive and natural spaces and amenities that foster healthy lifestyles in rural communities.				
	• The 2016-approved OSP recommended a high-level 5-year progress review and update. This review was approved at the June 8, 2021 Council meeting. The focus was on the following:				
	 Define County open space based on the asset inventory; 				
	 Consolidate and prioritize regional open space plans; 				
	 Revise open space and trail typologies and level of service (LOS) standards and define principles; 				
	 Enhance decision-making tools for capital projects and the acquisition and disposition of open space; 				
	 Enhance environmental stewardship tools and strategies; 				
	 Develop additional maps and visuals spatializing the County vision; and 				
	 Define the scope of regional partnerships. 				
	 Key Findings and Recommendations The Open Space Plan (2022) Review and Update will be an appendix report to the approved Open Space Plan (2016). 				
	 A key recommendation is the development of 16 typologies included in three primary categories (transects): 1. wild and natural areas, 2. working landscapes, and 3. developed areas. These typologies are more reflective of a rural landscape, including wetlands, grasslands, reclaimed resource extraction areas, urban forests, and urban streetscapes. The transects and a couple of typology examples are provided in Attachment 1. 				
	• The acquisition of Environmental and Municipal Reserves (ER/MR) for new development will be guided by the proposed minimum and				

	maximum parcel sizes and high-level human and ecological activities suggested for each site.				
	• The OSP recommends the use of a Capital Project Scoring Matrix to assess and prioritize projects provided in Attachment 2.				
	• The review includes 15 policy recommendations that should influence new policy and amendments to both existing statutory plans and non-statutory provided in Attachment 3.				
	 Administration is proposing that <u>four key policy recommendations out of</u> <u>the 15</u> be accepted now by Council to guide open space planning and capital investments for the next 5 years as outlined in the recommendation above. 				
	A comprehensive review of best practices and leading trends was completed.				
	• The County maintains approximately 1,695 hectares of public open space, which was formally inventoried and mapped during this process.				
	• The draft OSP Review and Update document is provided in Attachment 4.				
	 External Communication The intent of this review was to assess progress made on the OSP and to address gaps in the original OSP to advance the Open Space Program area. It will guide how resources are allocated to Open Space planning, investments, and management. The OSP and its updated document will be made available to the public on the County website. 				
	<u>Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices</u> The OSP is a non-statutory plan. The Municipal Development Plan states under RG 1.3: <i>Developing and adopting Management Plans, Master Plan</i> <i>and Strategies that align with the vision and direction of the MDP and</i> <i>Capital Region Growth Plan.</i>				
Implication of Administrative Recommendation	Strategic Alignment: Open Space investment is a key priority for Council. The OSP assesses progress and identifies key recommendations to enhance alignment with the objectives of the County's Strategic Plan by setting a direction, outcomes, and goals.				
	Operational Excellence – Enhancing mechanisms for land management that are consistent with legislation, master plans, policies, and procedures.				
	Thriving Communities – Committing the proposed resources to this project will support the development of integrated natural spaces and trail systems, cultivating safe, beautiful, and complete communities.				
	Planned Growth – Correcting open space deficiencies and defining new development expectations demonstrates Sturgeon County's commitment to fund asset improvements that affect residents, advancing Council's strategic priority of enhanced recreational and green infrastructure.				

	Collaborative Governance – Endorsing this project plan would reinforce Council's commitment to ongoing community consultation and engagemen and leveraging regional partnerships
	Environmental Stewardship – OSP makes key recommendations to assess, identify and sustainably manage County land and new acquisitions which highlights Council's commitment to sustainable land management.
	Organizational: Subject to Council direction, further planning and implementation of the recommendations over the next five years to enhance open space will impact budget decisions and the allocation of resources. The OSP will infor the Open Space Program area to plan its work, as well as define what skills will be necessary for new positions and contracted services. Additional wor to enhance collaboration among impacted departments will be advanced, e.g., operations, structure, service levels, staff capacity.
	Financial: The OSP provides a framework for Council consideration to assist with prioritizing and allocating funds to investments in open space. A consolidated Plan coordinates processes and standards to enable Administration to provide a well-defined project list for Council's consideration. Council approved Budget 2022, which includes \$1,573,875 for the Open Space Program.

Follow up Action	 Prepare the OSP and Update to post on the County website and share with relevant stakeholders (Open Space Lead/Community Services, Q2 2022). Prepare a well-defined project list for Council's consideration for the 2022 approved budget (Open Space Lead/Community Services, Q2 2022). Initiate process to prepare Open Space budget for the next three years
