In place of these cancelled meetings, it is recommended that Regular Council Meetings be scheduled for Friday, April 22, 2022 and Tuesday, May 3, 2022.

Report	 Background Information In accordance with section 193 of the Municipal Government Act (MGA), Council may decide at a Council meeting at which all members are present, the dates, times, and locations of regularly scheduled Council meetings. 		
	 At the October 26, 2021 Organizational Council Meeting, the dates of 2022 Regular Council Meetings were approved, which included April 26 and May 10, 2022. 		
	 Since the time of the approval of the 2022 Council Meeting Calendar, two high priority events have been confirmed, with some members of Council and Administration expressing interest in attending these in- person events: 		
	 Canadian Hydrogen Convention – April 26-28, 2022 in Edmonton (conflicts with April 26 Council meeting). 		
	 Alberta Community Crime Prevention Association (ACCPA) Conference – May 9-11, 2022 in Canmore (conflicts with May 10 Council meeting). 		
	Conferences such as these are invaluable for delegates to receive timely updates on priority initiatives, learn information that can be brought		

back and applied in Sturgeon County, and network with other delegates, speakers, and stakeholders.

- It is recommended that the April 26 and May 10, 2022 Regular Council Meetings be cancelled, with a Regular Council Meeting to be scheduled for Tuesday, May 3, 2022. Administration has confirmed that there are no known conflicts with this revised meeting date.
- Section 276(3) of the Municipal Government Act (MGA) requires that
 municipalities make their Financial Statements for the preceding year
 available to the public by May 1. With the cancellation of April 26
 Council meeting, it is required for Council to meet before May 1 to
 approve the Financial Statements. Therefore, it is recommended that a
 short meeting be scheduled for Friday, April 22 at 3:00 p.m. for Council
 for this purpose. Administration has confirmed that there are no known
 conflicts with this revised meeting date.
