Report	<ul> <li>Background Information</li> <li>The Meadowview Drive Phase 2 Collector Reconstruction contract consists of grading, granular base course, asphalt concrete pavement, and other work, including asphalt removal and disposal, rebuilding existing residential / farm approaches, culvert Installation, erosion and sediment control, ditch cleaning, sign installation, and line painting.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The total length of project is approximately 4.3 kilometres.</li> <li>External Communication</li> <li>Tendering</li> <li>Tenders for the Meadowview Drive Phase 2 Collector Reconstruction project were posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC) on March 25, 2022 and closed on April 26, 2022.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Five bids were received, ranging from \$4,895,749.40 to \$9,776,465.85 excluding GST.</li> <li>Administration reviewed the tenders and recommends that the contract for the Meadowview Drive Reconstruction Phase 2 project be awarded</li> </ul>
	to Integrity Infrastructure Inc. as the lowest compliant bidder.  Communications  Notifications will be mailed to all affected residents following the

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contract award and prior to construction commencing.

## Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

### **Procurement Policy**

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the Alberta Purchasing Connection.
- Purchases exceeding \$500,000 are to be ratified at the following Council Meeting.
- The Chief Administrative Officer shall be signing authority for all Construction or Capital contracts over \$500,000.

## Implication of Administrative Recommendation

### Strategic Alignment:

**Planned Growth** – The awarding of this contract is consistent with: *Reliable* and effective infrastructure.

**Operational Excellence** – The awarding of this contract is consistent with: *Quality cost-effective service delivery; asset management and performance measurement.* 

## Organizational:

 The award of this contract will significantly reduce the maintenance requirements of these road segments, thereby freeing up additional capacity to maintain Sturgeon County's service commitment to operational excellence.

## Financial:

The estimated total cost to complete the Meadowview Drive Phase 2
 Collector Reconstruction project is \$7,067,324.00. The available funding for this project is \$8,000,000.00.

## Implications of Alternatives

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### Organizational:

 By not awarding the contract, Sturgeon County would be required to continue intensive maintenance, requiring further resources to maintain an acceptable level of service.

### Financial:

 Not awarding this contract would only temporarily defer the required capital renewal cost for this asset.

- 2. Send notification letters to residents and install construction information signs (Transportation & Engineering Services, Q2, 2022).
