Request for Decision

2022 Open Space Capital Projects Title 1. That Council approve the proposed 2022 Open Space Capital Project List **Proposed Motion** not to exceed the \$1,573,825 budget allocated for Open Space. 2. That Council authorize the Mayor to send a letter to the Minister of Alberta Environment and Parks in support of developing an equestrian staging site at the Redwater Sandhills Recreation Area and direct Administration to forward the same letter to Administration at the Ministry. Administrative Administration recommends that Council approve the proposed 2022 Open Recommendation Space Project List as presented in Attachment 1. Further, Administration recommends that the Mayor send a letter to the Minister of Alberta Environment and Parks supporting the development of an equestrian staging site at the Redwater Sandhills Recreation Area and direct Administration to forward the same letter to Administration at the Ministry. Report

Background Information

- On April 12, 2022, Council approved the following policies and principles to be used for prioritizing projects over the next five years:
 - Sturgeon County will create development guidelines and policy that includes principles of biodiversity and low-impact development to help prioritize the protection of the natural environment;
 - Ensure there is a cross-section of open space initiatives and acquisitions that are representative of the diversity of open spaces identified in the inventory; and
 - Support the environmental conservation, protection, and enhancement of County-owned open space for present and future generations:
 - Strategic importance (Plan alignment, regulatory, safety, lifecycle maintenance, cost efficiency, and multi-year capital plan sequencing);
 - Environmental ethics;
 - Community well-being and leading practice; and
 - Contributing to a sense of place (identity, history, culture, and design).
- Based on this overall policy direction, a review of existing plans, completed studies, and public engagements undertaken in 2021, the proposed project list is deemed to be reflective of community priorities that Administration has the capacity to properly deliver to a standard of success.
- To support project success going forward, Administration is recommending improvements to processes, standards, land management practices, bylaws, and policies. This work will better position the County for future investments.
- The proposed projects for 2022 are added to those already approved and underway from 2021 and need to be considered in the context of existing resources. All future projects will be assessed using the open space capital planning evaluation matrix.
- The future Open Spaces Capital Plan will also be included in the 2023-2025 budget process that will require Council's input and direction, possible public engagement, assessment of existing approved Plans, and evaluation tools. One notable project that will be added to the list for consideration is the Casa Vista pedestrian bridge, which was discussed during the May 6, 2022 Capital Planning Committee meeting.
- Depending on Council's direction for additional engagement, engineering support, and further feasibility work relating to the projects

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- in Attachment 1, Administration will review and identify related resource requirements.
- Projects from the 2021 budget including collaborating with Alberta Environment and Parks and the Alberta Trail Riding Association (ATRA) to develop an equestrian staging area at the Redwater Sandhills Recreation Area. Council approved up to \$100,000 for both Opal and Redwater initiatives in 2021. Alberta Parks administration has stated that the Province approved \$30,000 in the 2023 budget to undertake the detailed planning and design for a staging area. Depending on the final project scope, it could be considered in the 2024-2025 capital budget. Provincial staff have indicated that projects may be expedited if a municipality would like to partner, often through a financial contribution or incentive. It was recommended that a letter from Sturgeon County be sent to the Minister of Environment and Parks supporting the equestrian staging area project by offering a financial contribution.

External Communication

Administration is preparing a webpage dedicated to Open Space Planning and Development, including a section describing existing and upcoming projects and improvements. The project list will be added to the website with contact information to support the communication of proposed work and related engagements to the community.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices

The Open Spaces Plan is a non-statutory plan. The Municipal Development Plan states under RG 1.3: *Developing and adopting Management Plans, Master Plan and Strategies that align with the vision and direction of the MDP and Capital Region Growth Plan.*

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

- Continued investment in the County's Open Spaces promotes a vision of protecting, preserving, and promoting the County's beautiful, natural spaces.
- Responsible use of the vast amount of open space promotes community building.
- 2022 investments align with 2021 decisions and will impact projects for advancement in 2023.

Operational Excellence – Enhancing mechanisms for land management that are consistent with legislation, master plans, policies, and procedures.

Thriving Communities – Committing the proposed resources to this project will support the development of integrated natural spaces and trail systems, cultivating safe, beautiful, and complete communities.

Planned Growth – Proposed projects demonstrate Sturgeon County's commitment to fund improvements to existing assets that effect residents, advancing Council's strategic priority of enhanced open space and recreational infrastructure.

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Collaborative Governance – Endorsing this project plan would reinforce Council's commitment to ongoing regional partnerships, community consultation and engagement.

Environmental Stewardship – Key projects will assess, identify, and sustainably manage County land and new acquisitions which highlights Council's commitment to sustainable land management.

Organizational:

The Open Space Program area will be expanded this year with the addition of a Director and support position to the Open Space Lead. Some support may be required from contracted services for project management and engagement.

Financial:

The project list prioritizes and allocates the funds Council approved in its 2022 Budget of \$1,573,875 for open space. Based on Council's previous direction, ongoing public engagement, the Open Space Plan, and technical studies, Administration is able to provide a well-defined project list for Council's consideration based on the recommendation from the Capital Committee.
