Report	<ul> <li>Background Information</li> <li>The 2022 Local Road Program project consists of earthworks, grading, granular base course, and paving for segments of the roadways within Sturgeon County.</li> </ul>

There are two main components included in this project.

- The first component consists of reconstruction of Range Road 272 between Township Road 540 and Highway 633 (3.2 kilometres).
- The second component involves intersection improvements at Highway 633 (approximately 100 metres) of paved acceleration and deceleration lane construction.

# **Tendering**

- Tenders for the 2022 Local Road Program Construction Contract were posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC) on May 12, 2022 with a closing date of June 7, 2022.
- Five (5) bids were received, ranging from \$2,068,704.30 to \$3,210,210, excluding GST.
- Administration reviewed the received tenders and recommends that Sturgeon County award the contract for the 2022 Local Road Program to PME Inc. as the lowest compliant bidder.

 Following the contract award and prior to construction startup, notifications will be mailed to all affected residents.

#### Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

# **Procurement Policy**

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the Alberta Purchasing Connection.
- Purchases exceeding \$500,000 are to be ratified at the following Council Meeting.

The Chief Administrative Officer shall be signing authority for all Construction or Capital contracts over \$500,000.

# Implication of Administrative Recommendation
