Title	Closure and Consolidation of a Portion of Road Plan 7880Y (Portion of Range Road 261A)			
Proposed Motion	That Council support the resolution provided in Attachment 1 of item 6.6 of the June 28, 2022 Regular Council Meeting Agenda to facilitate the closure and consolidation of a portion of Road Plan 7880Y (portion of Range Road 261A).			
Administrative	Administration recommends the proposed closure given that the			
Recommendation	construction of the new realigned portion of road has been completed.			
Previous Council / Committee Direction	None.			
Report	 Background Information Due to the active erosion of the outer bank of the Sturgeon River adjacent to Range Road 261A (located approximately 100 metres north of Meadowview Drive), a slope assessment was conducted in 2018 for the County. 			
	• As per the assessment report, the recommendations were to realign Range Road 261A further to the west and to reinforce the outer riverbank where the active erosion has been occurring. Both these items were completed in 2021 as part of the Range Road 261A Realignment Project.			
	• As part of this project, an agreement was reached with the owner of River Lot 2, St. Albert Settlement, whereby the land required for the new road alignment would be exchanged for the old road allowance to be closed.			
	• To finalize the above agreement, the old road allowance must be officially closed. With a Council resolution, the portion of closed road will be returned to the title that it was excepted from without the need for a transfer of land to be registered at Land Titles or a consolidation with the parcel.			
	 External Communication The matter was circulated within Administration, to adjacent landowners, and to Fortis, ATCO Gas, and Telus. No objections were noted. 			

	• The matter was circulated to Alberta Transportation. While no response was received at the time of preparing this report, in accordance with Part 24 of the <i>Municipal Government Act</i> , the Minister of Transportation
	 Fart 24 of the Manicipal Government Act, the Minister of Hansportation typically grants consent <i>after</i> a municipal resolution is approved. <u>Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices</u> Section 24 of the Municipal Government Act: "The council of a municipal district may by resolution, with the approval of the Minister of Transportation, close the whole or any part of a road described in a surveyed road plan that the council determines is no longer required for use by the travelling public owing to the existence of an alternate route".
Implication of Administrative Recommendation	Strategic Alignment: Operational Excellence – The realignment of the Range Road 261A is consistent with the County's work to upgrade road infrastructure when needed.
	Organizational: Administration has capacity to work with the applicant to finalize the necessary documentation for Alberta Land Titles and the Minister of Transportation.
	<u>Financial:</u> Compensation to the County from the landowner is not required.
Alternatives Considered	Council could deny the road closure.
Implications of Alternatives	<u>Strategic Alignment:</u> Sturgeon County would continue to retain the redundant road allowance and not comply with the agreement made with the private landowner. <u>Organizational:</u> Additional Administrative effort to work with the landowner would be
	required. <u>Financial:</u> The County would have to compensate the landowner for the portion of land that was taken for the road realignment.
Follow up Action	 Finalize the necessary documentation for Alberta Land Titles and the Minister of Transportation (Planning & Development Services, June/July 2022).
