Title	Contract Award: Coal Mine Road and Range Road 252 Reconstruction and Surfacing
Proposed Motion	That Council award the contract for the Coal Mine Road and Range Road 252 Reconstruction and Surfacing project to PME Inc. at a contract price of \$4,726,244.50 (excluding GST) and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the contract.

Report E

Background Information

- Coal Mine Road: The project limits are from west of Township Road 544
 to east of Estate Way Drive (1.8 kilometres). As part of the construction,
 the intersection of Township Road 544 and Coal Mine Road will be
 realigned to improve the approach angle and sight lines (0.3 kilometres).
 The total length for this work is 2.1 kilometres. The work will consist of
 full reconstruction and surfacing of the road with a new asphalt
 structure.
- Range Road 252: The project limits are from Bellerose Drive to Coal Mine Road. The intersection at Bellerose Drive will also be upgraded with a bypass lane and acceleration/deceleration lanes coming off Bellerose Drive onto Range Road 252. This work is 1.0 kilometres in length. This work has the same construction strategy as Coal Mine Road, which consists of full reconstruction and surfacing of the road with a new asphalt structure.

External Communication

Tendering

- Tenders for the Coal Mine Road and Range Road 252 Reconstruction and Surfacing project were advertised on Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC) starting May 20, 2022. The tender period closed on June 14, 2022.
- Six (6) compliant bids were received, ranging from \$4,726,244.50 to \$5,723,316.36 (excluding GST).

 The received tenders were reviewed, and it is recommended that Sturgeon County award the contract for the Coal Mine Road and Range Road 252 Reconstruction and Surfacing project to PME Inc. as the lowest compliant bidder.

Communications

- Following the contract award and prior to commencement of construction:
 - Notifications will be mailed to all affected residents.
 - Construction information signs will be installed.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

Procurement Policy

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the Alberta Purchasing Connection.
- Purchases exceeding \$500,000 shall be ratified at the following Council Meeting.

The Chief Administrative Officer shall be signing authority for all Construction or Capital contracts over \$500,000.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

Planned Growth – The awarding of this contract is consistent with *Reliable* and effective infrastructure.

Two previous road closures into St. Albert have limited pavement connectivity from the west end of the Valley. This project, with a connection via Range Road 252 onto Bellerose Drive, re-establishes paved access for residents.

Operational Excellence – The awarding of this contract is consistent with *Quality cost-effective service delivery; asset management and performance measurement.*

Organizational:

 The awarding of this contract will reduce the maintenance requirements of this road segment thereby freeing up additional capacity to maintain Sturgeon County's service commitment to operational excellence.

Financial:

- To date, \$110,000 has been spent on feasibility, design, and procurement.
- As per the below table, the estimated total cost to complete the Coal Mine Road and Range Road 252 Reconstruction and Surfacing project is \$5,589,079.16. There is currently \$5,684,881 in available funds.

Alternatives Considered

- **Planned Growth** Not awarding the contract would be inconsistent with this strategic objective.
- **Operational Excellence** Not awarding the contract would be inconsistent this strategic objective.

Organizational:

 By not awarding the contract, Sturgeon County would be required to continue intensive maintenance requiring further resources to maintain an acceptable level of service.

Financial:

 Not awarding this contract would only temporarily defer the required capital renewal cost for this asset.

- 2. Mail notification letters out to residents (Transportation & Engineering Services, Q3, 2022)
- 3. Install construction information signage (Transportation & Engineering Services, Q3, 2022).
