## **Briefing Note**

Title 1:30 p.m. Public Hearing - Bylaw 1594/22 - Villeneuve Airport Area - Area Structure Plan

**Issue** To provide an opportunity for members of the public to present their comments to Council regarding the proposed Bylaw.

#### November 30, 2021 Regular Council Meeting

Motion 528/21: That Council authorize the commencement of an Area Structure Plan and associated statutory plan amendments for the study area, based on recommendations within the Villeneuve Airport Area Master Plan.

#### Report

#### **Background Information**

- Following first reading of Bylaw 1594/22 on June 14, 2022, Administration proceeded to schedule a Public Hearing. As part of the Public Hearing, Administration will be providing a summary presentation to highlight key components of the new Area Structure Plan (ASP) (Attachment 4).
- The presentation will also provide a summary of any written or telephone inquiries received after first reading and an overview of any opportunities and concerns identified by these stakeholders.

#### **External Communication**

- Notice of Public Hearing was advertised within:
  - Morinville Free Press and Redwater Review (June 29, 2022);
  - St. Albert Gazette (June 29 and July 6, 2022); and
  - Sturgeon County "Future Takes Flight" project website.
- Digital copies of the new ASP were made available on the Future Takes
   Flight project website and as part of the June 14, 2022 Regular Council

#### Meeting.

- Administration sent out official notice of First Reading and Public Hearing on June 14, 2022 to the following stakeholders/neighbouring municipalities:

- Administration has sent out courtesy email notices of first reading and Public Hearing to various key stakeholders, including: planning representatives from the City of St. Albert and the Town of Morinville, members of the Calahoo-Villeneuve Sand and Gravel Advisory Committee, and key representatives from the natural resource extraction industry.
- Email communications of first reading and Public Hearing were also sent to Villeneuve Landing Network partners which includes representatives from the Edmonton International Airport, First Nation communities, Edmonton Global, academia, industry, and various Edmonton Metropolitan area municipalities.
- Administration also met with Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board Administrative staff to discuss procedural Regional Evaluation Framework (REF) requirements in preparation for submittal of the Bylaw amendments following completion of second reading.
- Administration will continue to be available to answer questions and to provide background on the intent of any information related to Bylaw 1594/22.
- At the time of this report, Administration has received limited official comments from any of the above-mentioned stakeholders/neighbouring municipalities.

#### Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

- The *Municipal Government Act*, RSA 2000 c M-26, and amendments thereto (MGA) authorize Council to establish and amend Bylaws.
- Section 692 of MGA requires that a municipality hold a public hearing prior to giving second reading to a proposed bylaw.
- Ministerial Order L:111/17 (Establishment of the Regional Evaluation Framework) requires that all new Area Structure Plans be referred to and approved by the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board.

 Ministerial Order L:111/17 (Establishment of the Regional Evaluation Framework) requires all other statutory plans be referred to the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board for approval, should they meet the criteria as outlined in sections 4.1, 4.2 and 4.3 of the Regional Evaluation Framework.

#### **Implication**

#### **Strategic Alignment:**

**Planned Growth** – Council's previous approval for progression to the development of the new Area Structure Plan for the Villeneuve Airport Area is a direct complement to Council's "Planned Growth" priority, in addition to all other priority areas of Sturgeon County's Strategic Plan. The project is also directly referenced as a priority within the County's Corporate Business Plan.

#### Organizational:

The Future Takes Flight initiative has been a large-scale undertaking for Administration.

#### **Financial:**

Cost of advertising the Public Hearing is funded through existing budget allocations.

#### **Follow Up Action**

- 1. Consolidate new information presented as part of the Public Hearing and referrals process, and report on any possible adjustments for second reading (Planning and Development Services, July / August 2022).
- 2. Complete submittals required as part of the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board Regional Evaluation Framework process (Planning and Development Services, following second reading).
