Report	 Background Information Bridge maintenance requirements are identified by an annual inspection program that identifies repairs to extend the service life of the bridge structures managed by the County. 		
	This bridge maintenance tender includes the following scope of work:		
	 Bridge File 02404 – Range Road 262 north of Highway 37 – Tributar to the Sturgeon River (Bridge Culvert – 2314 x 2552 Vertically Ellipsed SPCSP Culvert x 23.8 metres - invert length) 		
	 Regrade side slopes, placement of riprap and other repairs. 		
	 Bridge File 07513 – Range Road 251 (Starkey Road south of Bellerose Drive) – Sturgeon River (Major Bridge - 41.5 metres - NU Girder Bridge on Concrete substructure) 		
	 Grout Voids, ACP Patching, and other repairs 		
	 Bridge File 13354 – Range Road 261 north of Highway 37 – Tributar to the Sturgeon River (Standard Bridge – 6.1 metres - HC Girder Bridge on Treated Timber substructure) 		
	 Full depth concrete repairs, strut repairs, pile repairs, and other work. 		
	 Bridge File 74468 – Township Road 580 east of Range Road 243 – Fairydell Creek (Standard Bridge - 6.1 metres - PG Girder Bridge on Treated Timber substructure) 		
	 Pile repairs, full depth concrete repairs, and other work. 		

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- Bridge File 75155 Township Road 552 west of Range Road 260 –
 Tributary to the Sturgeon River (Standard Bridge 6.1 metres HC
 Girder Bridge on Treated Timber substructure)
 - Girder repairs, pile and backwall repairs, placement of riprap, and other repairs.
- Bridge File 78734 Range Road 271 south of Highway 37 Sturgeon River (10.7-10.7-10.7 metres - VS Girder Bridge on Treated Timber substructure)
 - Girder repairs, concrete deck repairs, and other work.
- Bridge File 76676 Range Road 252 north of Highway 642 Little Egg Creek (Standard Bridge - 6.1 metres - HC Girder Bridge on Treated Timber substructure). A portion of this work includes remediation of the bridge, as well as a portion of work attributed to other deficiencies required by the Town of Morinville. The value of the work associated with this work is estimated at \$90,000, which includes engineering.
 - Girder repairs, repairs to piles, backwall, placement of riprap and other repairs.
- Select bid items were deleted from the contract as they were not viewed as good value for dollar and therefore are deferred and will be incorporated into a future tender to achieve more favourable results.

External Communication

Tendering

- The construction Request for Tender (RFT) for the Bridge Maintenance Contract was posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC) May 30, 2022 with a closing date of June 16, 2022.
- The tenders were reviewed and assessed in accordance with standard practices before making the recommendation to award to the lowest compliant bidder.

Communications

 Following the contract award and prior to commencement of work, roadside notification will be installed.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices

Procurement Policy

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the Alberta Purchasing Connection.
- Purchases exceeding \$500,000 shall be ratified at the following Council Meeting.

The Chief Administrative Officer is designated with approval authority for procurements of \$500,000 and in excess thereof.

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Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Organizational

 The awarding of this contract will ensure that this bridge structures will remain safe and open to traffic for County residents.

Financial

- Year to date, \$75,382 has been spent on bridge maintenance.
- As per the below table, the estimated total cost to complete the Bridge Maintenance Contract #2 is \$590,780. There is currently \$838,960 in available funds.

Alternatives Considered

Council could decide not to award the contract at this time.

Implications of Alternatives

Strategic Alignment

Planned Growth – Not awarding the contract would be inconsistent with this strategic objective.

Operational Excellence – Not awarding the contract would be inconsistent with this strategic objective.

Should this contract not be awarded, Sturgeon County's overall lifecycle cost of maintaining these assets will increase, thus decreasing the affordability. There is also a moderately increased safety risk to the travelling public driving as deteriorated roads can increases collision risk.

Organizational

 By not awarding the contract at this time, Sturgeon County may be required to preemptively close bridge structures in the future due to poor conditions.

Financial

Not awarding this contract would only temporarily defer the required operational repair cost for these bridge assets.
