Title	Contract Award: Bridge File 2212 Cunningham Bridge (Meadowview Drive East of Range Road 261A) Project
Proposed Motion	That Council award the contract for the rehabilitation of Bridge File 2212 (Cunningham Bridge) to Bridgemen Services Ltd. at a contract price of \$1,336,800, excluding GST, and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the contract.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council award the contract for rehabilitation of Bridge File 2212 (Contract No. 2022-098) to Bridgemen Services Ltd. as the lowest compliant bidder.

Report	 Background Information Candidates for bridge rehabilitation are identified by an annual inspection program that identifies repairs to extend the service life of the bridge structures managed by the County.
	• The Bridge Structure, BF 2212, on Meadowview Drive crossing the Sturgeon River was built in 1958 and is nearing the end of its service life.
	• The County completed an engineering and cost-benefit analysis on the existing structure in Q1-Q2 2022 to determine the best option (repair, rehab or replace) to extend the service life of the structure. The engineering assessment included a review of all available documentation, site inspection (including a level 2 girder inspection), load rating evaluation, and an assessment of the existing condition.
	• The latest Bridge Inspection and Maintenance (BIM) report was completed on February 15, 2022. The superstructure and substructure have a general rating of 3 (poor) with various degradation to the concrete girder components of the structure and various other noted areas.
	• The overall condition of this structure is fair considering its age (64 years). However, there are several deficient items that are leading to accelerated deterioration of critical bridge components (e.g., bearings and girders).

• Further, a previous BIM inspection, dated January 18, 2018, indicated that there was a large void under the approach slab at the southwest corner and that the angle of the approach slab suggested ongoing settlement. The approach slab was also noted to be pulling away from the backwall. The void under the approach slab at the southwest corner has since been repaired. The approach slabs were not visible during the most recent inspection, but it is suspected that the approach slabs have failed at both ends of the bridge. To reduce future approach settlement, the approach slabs should be replaced.
• Based on the assessment completed, it was recommended to complete a full rehabilitation of the bridge structure as the most cost-effective option to extend the service life of the structure for an assumed 25 years.
• By completing this project in conjunction with the ongoing roadwork on Meadowview Drive, all road and bridge assets within the portion of Meadowview owned by Sturgeon County will be fully rehabilitated, limiting future construction impacts to residents
 This bridge rehabilitation project scope of work includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 Traffic accommodation;
 Surface removal;
 Cold milling of asphalt concrete pavement (ACP);
 Partial depth repairs to the deck, curbs, abutments, diaphragms, pier, and girders;
 Crack repairs to pier and girders;
 Replacement of all deck joints;
 Replacement and refurbishment of all bearings;
 Replacement of approach slabs;
 Concrete surface finish (sealer) to abutments, piers, curbs, and exterior girder fascia;
 Bridge rail repairs and upgrade;
 Installation of approach guardrail;
 Roadway work;
 Installation of waterproofing membrane;
 Asphalt concrete pavement; and
 Installation of drain troughs.
• The BF 2212 Rehabilitation project requires all works to be completed prior to August 15, 2023. Bridgemen Services' submitted schedule is to have the project completed in June 2023.
External Communication
 The construction Request for Tender (RFT) for the Bridge Maintenance Contract was posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC) July 15, 2022 and closed on August 15, 2022.

Follow up Action	 Execute the contract with the lowest compliant bidder (CAO Office, Q4 2022). Notify affected residents (Transportation & Engineering Services, Q1 2023).
