Lessons learned and go forward



Brief history

- 2010 CYXD closure. CoE asked for a transition project. Airshow designed to keep business here and incent a move to CZVL
- 2013 ERAA approached RWE to reaffirm support and approach for 2014 airshow
- 2014 Show pushed to 2015. Trial run with a visiting B-25 and DC-3.
- 2015 Initial Show. ERAA, GoA, and Sturgeon County participated.
- 2016 Year 2. F-16 from USAF.
- 2017 Snowbirds. \$20K from break even
- 2018 Smoke. Miracle at 09:30. Many acts cancelled. Still put on show. \$280K loss



Brief history

- 2019 intense rain 2 weeks prior lead to cancellation. Litigation with Lloyds/Insured Creative ongoing. \$680K loss plus damages
- 2020 COVID
- 2021 last minute approval to allow major events in restricted covid times
- 2022 Snowbirds accident at Ft. St. John cancelled main act appearance. Show postponed.



2023 – Where we are

- Prairies Canada Tourism Relief Fund will not be extended
 - Transit
 - Arrestor gear
 - Fly in
 - New infrastructure
 - Contact with GoC for replacement funding
 - Considered for Prairies Canada Aerospace Regional Recovery Initiative



2023 – Where we are

GoA

- UCP leadership vote, followed by resignation, followed by campaign
 - Ask still in process within transition
 - 2.5 over 5 (\$500k per year spread over 10 ministries at \$50K ea)
 - Road construction, new grass, approaches, marketing, etc
 - Aligned to recent funding announcements with the WestJet hub in YYC

Region

- Leduc County approached, reviewing options and also combining with the City of Leduc (chalet, etc)
- Parkland/Spruce/Stony being re-approached
- St Albert not approached yet



2023 – Where we are

- Without salvaging 2022 relationships, 2023 tenuous.
 - USAF/USMC/USN on board. Several asks already confirmed. Announce in December at ICAS
 - RCAF has Villeneuve as a major stop in 2024 100 anniversary of the RCAF celebrations
 - AIAC/ADSE convention hosting still being worked on
 - Local vendors EE finally paid commitments late sept
 - US vendors still unpaid
 - Team still unpaid
 - ICAS relationship still on good grounds, but AIA needs to complete the US vendor payouts.



2023 – funding drive

- Attending 2022 Western Sponsorship Congress in Edmonton
 - Gratis admission courtesy of Tanner Young and Timewise Productions
 - Access to Western Canadian market
- New ministers
 - Networking via Chiefs of Staff that are retained as well as Alberta Council network
- Federal Minister of Tourism
- Major air carrier indicating to retain 2022 interest
- PNWER contacts (AK, WA, ID, MT)



2023 – name and brand

- Airshow too limiting
 - Funding issues
 - Immediately omits the entire vision and makes it just another airshow
- Test market
 - WestJet, Air Canada, AB Tourism, GoA ministries, Calgary Economic Development, De Havilland, Leduc County, and others





2023 – VilleAero

- Combines Villeneuve and Aerospace
 - Acknowledges location
 - Villeneuve also has a racing connection
 - Villeneuve (or new village) aligns to our look at the future, so a new village of new aerospace projects, and associated industries
 - Quick and rolls off the tongue
 - Presenting sponsorship v title omits name change
 - Allows expansion into fly-in, exposition allows for more displays and corporate inclusion

Key Additions needed (info only)

- Permanent arrester gear mounts \$250K
- Reseeding and grooming 200ac \$60K
- Expansion of approaches \$50K
- Permanent infrastructure on site
 - Avoids \$100 120K in portable tents and labour
- Permanent fencing
 - ~2 miles 3 wire non barbed @\$8-12K per mile - ~\$24K
