	Sturgeon County uses various Microsoft products in order to provide

	 Cloud services – Outlook, OneDrive, Teams, Teams Voice,
	SharePoint, PowerApps, Azure
	 Computer management – Anti-virus, security monitoring,
	workstation management, and training and consulting
	• The County has an existing Microsoft Enterprise Agreement that reduces
	the cost of this software and services and fixes prices for the length of
	the agreement. The Enterprise Agreement must be renewed every three
	years.
	• Costs are primarily based on the number of staff and their role (office
	worker, field worker) plus Azure usage. The price per user is fixed, but
	overall costs are anticipated to increase as additional users are added
	and/or additional capabilities are used.
	Using 2023 staff levels, costs are approximately \$285,000 per year, or
	\$855,000 over the life of the agreement assuming no license changes.
	Existing costs are funded through the annual operating budget. Growth requirements will be presented to Council appually through the budget
	requirements will be presented to Council annually through the budget process.
