Title	2023 Community Grant and Family & Community Services Grant Allocations
Proposed Motion	 That Council approve the Calahoo-Villeneuve Sand and Gravel Advisory Committee recommendation to award the 2023 Community Grants in the amount of \$375,382 to the community groups identified in Attachment 1, with \$358,822 funded from Community Enhancement Reserve A-ASP Group and \$16,560 from 2023 operating budget.
	2. That Council approve the Community Services Advisory Board recommendation to award the 2023 Community Grants in the amount of \$244,905 to the community groups identified in Attachment 2, with \$144,961.02 funded from Community Enhancement Reserve B- Recognized Community Groups, \$25,883.98 from Community Enhancement Reserve C-Reserves, and \$74,060 from 2023 operating budget.
	3. That Council approve the Community Services Advisory Board recommendation to fund the 2023 Family & Community Support Services Grants as identified in Attachment 3 in the amount of \$10,000 from the 2023 operating budget.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council award the grants as recommended by the Calahoo-Villeneuve Sand and Gravel Advisory Committee and the Community Services Advisory Board. These recommendations were debated and supported by both Council Committees during their respective meetings in March 2023.
Previous Council / Committee Direction	November 23 & 24, 2022 Council Budget Meeting Motion 443/22: That Council recommend approval of the Grant Funding for Not-For-Profit Organizations to be ongoing in the amount of \$48,330 from taxation.
	<u>December 13, 2022 Regular Council Meeting</u> Motion 481/21: That Council approve the 2023 Operating Budget as amended by motions passed on November 23 and 24, 2022, which represents a 3.9% tax rate increase.

Report	 Background Information The deadline to apply for 2023 Sturgeon County Community Associations grants was February 6, 2023 					
	 Between the three grant streams, 29 volunteer organizations submitted applications with \$630,287 in total funding requested. 					
	 The Calahoo-Villeneuve Sand and Gravel Advisory Committee (CVSGAC) received \$16,560 in requests for Operating Funding and are recommending that Council approve \$16,560. The CVSGAC received \$358,822 in requests for Capital Enhancement Funding and is recommending that Council approve \$358,822. The total of both operating and capital funding recommendations is \$375,382. 					
	 The Community Services Advisory Board (CSAB) received \$78,233 in requests for Operating Funding and is recommending that Council approve \$78,233. The CSAB received \$166,672 in requests for Capital Enhancement Funding and is recommending that Council approve \$166,672. The total of both operating a capital funding recommendation is \$244,905. 					
	 As part of Budget 2023, Council approved an increase of 15% to the maximum operating grant available; with Recognized Community Associations able to apply for up to \$4,600 (up from \$4,000) and Recognized Seniors Associations able to apply for up to \$1,380 (up from \$1,200). 					
	 The CSAB also received \$10,000 in requests for Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) funding and approved \$10,000 (Attachment 3).
