# **Request for Decision**

Title	Contract Award: 2023 Pavement Preservation – Micro-Surfacing
Proposed Motion	That Council award the contract for the 2023 Pavement Preservation Micro-Surfacing Program to West-Can Seal Coating Inc. at a contract price of \$699,053.25 (excluding GST) and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the contract.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council award contract for the 2023 Pavement Preservation Micro-Surfacing Program to West-Can Seal Coating Inc., as the lowest compliant bidder.

Report	<ul> <li>Background Information</li> <li>The 2023 Pavement Preservation (Micro-Surfacing) Program contract consists of the following road segments (see Attachment 1): <ol> <li>Bellerose Drive (1.85km)</li> <li>Sunnyside Road (5.90km)</li> </ol> </li> <li>External Communication</li> <li>Tendering <ol> <li>Tenders for the 2023 Pavement Preservation were posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection ("APC") on February 23, 2023, and closed on March 16, 2023.</li> <li>One (1) bid was received, at \$699,053.25 (excluding GST) (see Attachment 2).</li> <li>Administration reviewed the received tender and it meets all contract specifications. Therefore, Administration recommends that Council award the contract for the 2023 Pavement Preservation Program to West-Can Seal Coating Inc.</li> </ol></li></ul> <li>Communications <ul> <li>Following the contract award and prior to construction startup, notifications will be mailed to all affected residents.</li> </ul> </li>

## Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

## **Procurement Policy**

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the APC.
- Purchases exceeding \$500,000 are to be ratified at the following Council Meeting.
- The Chief Administrative Officer is the signing authority for all Construction or Capital contracts over \$500,000.

# Implication of Administrative Recommendation

## Strategic Alignment:

**Planned Growth** – The awarding of this contract is consistent with: *Reliable* and effective infrastructure.

**Operational Excellence** – The awarding of this contract is consistent with: Quality cost-effective service delivery; asset management and performance measurement.

### Organizational:

The awarding of this contract will reduce the maintenance requirements of this road segment thereby freeing up additional capacity to maintain Sturgeon County's service commitment to operational excellence.

## Financial:

- The estimated total cost to complete the 2023 Pavement Preservation (Micro-Surfacing) is \$699,035.25 (excluding GST). There is currently \$2,000,000 in available funds.
- A component of the work incorporated into and funded through the 2023 Pavement Preservation Program is a separate mill and fill pavement treatment.
