Proposed Motion	That Council appoint Erin McAdam, Stacy Berry, and Krysanne Carlson as additional Agricultural Fieldmen under the Alberta <i>Agricultural Service Board Act</i> .
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council appoint the individuals identified as additional Agricultural Fieldmen under the Alberta <i>Agricultural Service Board Act</i> .
Previous Council / Committee Direction	May 14, 2019 Regular Council Meeting Motion 159/19: That Council appoint Angela Veenstra, Tara McGinn, Victoria Dubord, Bradley Belanger and Shelayne Hofman as Agricultural Fieldmen under the Alberta Agricultural Service Board Act.
Report	 Background Information Agricultural Fieldmen aid in the implementation of agricultural policies and programs and manage the agricultural resources of a municipality. Agricultural Fieldmen are designated municipal inspectors under the Alberta Weed Control Act, Alberta Agricultural Pests Act and Alberta Soil Conservation Act, which are in place to protect the agricultural industry from the detrimental effects of weeds, pests, and soil erosion. If a board is established under the Agricultural Service Board Act, municipalities are responsible for ensuring that Agricultural Fieldmen are appointed to implement agricultural policies and programs. Sturgeon County receives Agricultural Service Board grant funds from the Government of Alberta to assist with the costs to operate eligible Agricultural Service Board Programs, under the condition that the County adheres to all requirements under the Agricultural Service Board Act. Failure to appoint Agricultural Fieldmen may result in failure to uphold the functions, duties, and powers of the municipality under the Alberta Weed Control Act, Alberta Agricultural Pests Act, Alberta Soil Conservation Act and Alberta Agricultural Service Board Act. Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices

Section 8(1) of the Agricultural Service Board Act requires Council to appoint qualified persons as Agricultural Fieldmen to implement agricultural policies and programs, manage agricultural resources of the municipality, and act as a designated officer under all Acts related to agriculture.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment

Collaborative Governance – Appointment of Agricultural Fieldmen is a responsibility delegated to municipalities by the Government of Alberta through the Agricultural Service Board Act, which positions municipalities to locally deliver programs and services vital to the agricultural sector, with the benefit of financial support through the Agricultural Service Board grant program.

Environmental Stewardship – The duties of appointed Agricultural Fieldmen are oriented toward the protection and stewardship of natural resources to support a thriving agricultural industry.

Council could decide not to appoint these additional individuals as Agricultural Fieldmen.

A decision not to appoint additional Agricultural Fieldmen may result in Sturgeon County being unable to uphold the legislative functions, duties and powers of the municipality under the Alberta Weed Control Act, Alberta Agricultural Pests Act, Alberta Soil Conservation Act, and the Alberta Agricultural Service Board Act.

Financial

Eligibility for Agricultural Service Board grant funding is contingent on appointing sufficient Agricultural Fieldmen.
