Request for Decision

Title Contract Award - Bridge File 08369 (Bridge Culvert Replacement on Range Road 251 North of Highway 642)

Proposed Motion

That Council award the contract for Bridge File 08369, Bridge Culvert Replacement on Range Road 251 North of Highway 642 and other work tender (2023-066), to Avid Energy Services Inc. at contract price of \$618,402.65 (excluding GST) and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the contract.

Administrative Recommendation

Administration recommends that Council award the contract for Bridge Culvert Replacement of Bridge File 08369 tender (2023-066) to Avid Energy Services Inc., as the lowest compliant bidder.

Report

Background Information

- Candidates for bridge rehabilitation are identified by an annual inspection program that identifies repairs to extend the services life of the bridge structures managed by the County.
- The existing structure of BF 08369 carries Range Road 251 over Little Egg Creek and is a 3734mm x 2286mm arched Structural Plate Corrugated Steel Pipe (SPCSP) that is 34.3m in length.
- The existing Bridge Culvert was installed in 1964 (59 years old), and the
 expected service life for this type of structure is typically 45-50 years.
 This structure is nearing the end of its practical service life and is
 scheduled for replacement in 2023.
- Hydraulic assessment has determined that the replacement structure requires an increase in capacity, requiring a larger structure than what currently exists.
- The Latest BIM inspection was completed on March 7, 2022. The culvert barrel general had a rating of 3 (poor); with rusting and pitting on the floor, and cracking and corrosion on various components.

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- A 1-4610mm SPCSP x 34.2m length culvert is recommended and would flow with 0.59m of freeboard during the design flow. The inlet and outlet velocities for this structure are within the Class 1 rock riprap armour range. The headwater created by this option is 1.71m lower than the headwater elevation created by the existing culvert during the design flow.
- This Bridge Culvert replacement Scope of Work includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - Bridge Culvert Installation of 1 4610mm Structural Plate Corrugated Steel Pipe (SPCSP);
 - Traffic accommodation;
 - Site isolation and turbidity monitoring;
 - Fish capture and release;
 - Demolition and disposal of bridge structures;
 - Excavation, including geotextile filter fabric;
 - Assembly of culvert materials;
 - Backfill, including backfill material testing;
 - Heavy rock riprap (Class 1) erosion protection;
 - o Permanent environmental protection devices;
 - o Roadway work; and
 - o Erosion and Sediment control devices.
- The BF 08369 replacement project requires all work to be completed prior to October 15, 2023.

External Communication

- The construction Request for Tender ("RFT") for the Bridge Replacement Contract was posted on Bids and Tenders and Alberta Purchasing Connection ("APC") on March 24, 2023 and closed on April 13, 2023.
- Seven (7) tender submissions ranging from \$618,402.65 to \$916,055.00 were reviewed and assessed in accordance with standard practice before making the recommendation to award to the lowest compliant bidder.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices

Procurement Policy

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the APC.
- The Chief Administrative Officer is designated with approval authority for procurements of \$500,000 and above.

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Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment:

Planned Growth – The awarding of this contract is consistent with the provision of *Reliable and effective infrastructure*.

Operational Excellence – The awarding of this contract is consistent with the delivery of *Quality cost-effective service delivery; asset management and performance measurement.*

Alternatives Considered

Council could decide not to award the contract at this time.

Implications of Alternatives

Organizational:

By not awarding the contract, Sturgeon County would be required to continue intensive maintenance requiring further resources to maintain an acceptable level of service.

Financial:

Not awarding this contract would only temporarily defer the required capital renewal cost for these assets.

- 1. Execute the contract with the lowest compliant bidder (CAO Office, Q2, 2023).
- 2. Send project notification letters to impacted residents (Transportation & Engineering Services, Q2 2023).
- 3. Place project information signs (Transportation & Engineering Services, Q2 2023).
