Report	Background Information

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Council's Budget Recommendations

- On September 10, 2019, upon the recommendation of the Citizen Task Force on Elected Official Remuneration, Council approved the Elected Official Remuneration Policy, which provides that elected officials should be fairly compensated for their time and expenses incurred representing the County (see Attachment 3).
- As part of the Policy, Administration is responsible to review and budget sufficient funds during the budget cycle for elected officials to carry out their respective duties.
- A review has been undertaken considering operations have now normalized since the height of the COVID-19 pandemic when
