Request for Decision

Title	2023 Alberta International Airshow Traffic Mitigation Support
Proposed Motion	That Council approve the Traffic Mitigation Strategy for the 2023 Alberta International Airshow and allocate funding from within the existing 2023 Operating Budget in the amount of \$70,000 for approach upgrades in the east parking lot at the Villeneuve Airport to support improved traffic flow and safety.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council support execution of the Traffic Mitigation Strategy and provide funds to upgrade four approaches in the east parking lot to reduce parking, highway, and county road traffic congestion issues.

Report Background Information

- The Alberta International Airshow (the Airshow) is both a public and privately hosted event at the Villeneuve Airport, and when held, attracts robust participation. In the past four years, one event has occurred.
 - The 2022 Airshow was cancelled due to a Snowbirds incident in Fort St. John, BC. The cancellation contributed to significant financial losses for the Airshow.
 - The 2021 Airshow was well attended despite a weather cancellation on the Sunday of the event. Estimated total attendance was approximately 25,000.
 - Previous Airshows in 2020 and 2019 were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic and severe rains and flooding. These cancellations contributed to significant financial losses for the Airshow.
- For the 2023 Airshow, event organizers have engaged with Sturgeon County and other municipal and provincial agencies and the Edmonton Regional Airports Authority regarding plans and financial / human support arrangements.
- For 2023, an Airshow is planned in addition to the VilleAero Alberta
 Aerospace Exhibition tentatively planned for August 2-3, 2023 at the
 Renaissance Hotel at the Edmonton International Airport. A new
 initiative is also planned, intended to highlight training and career
 opportunities for youth and young adults within specific sectors. This

Date Written: June 8, 2023 Page 2 of 6 initiative has been labeled VilleAero STEAM which is defined as "Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Music".

- Businesses from the region, including those within Sturgeon County, will be invited to showcase at a designated pavilion at the Airshow with a focus on training and career opportunities within their respective sectors.
- From a Sturgeon County perspective, a focus would be placed on the aerospace, defence, and clean technology sectors.
- Post-secondary institutions, including Grant MacEwan University and the University of Alberta, will also be invited to participate in the STEAM Initiative.
- The County has provided significant support to the Airshow event over the years. This includes \$25,000 for Enhanced Policing services, operational services, \$100,000 in additional funding for 2021, additional staff and elected official time, waiver of financial penalties, and more.
- Continued and enhanced support for the Airshow aligns to several goals, including the County's interests to:
 - Showcase the airport and area's importance for job creation through aviation, logistics, clean energy, defence and security, and other related investments to Sturgeon County's local and regional economic growth and diversification;
 - Attraction as a major tourism and cultural event, and to include local vendors;
 - Capitalize on recent infrastructure investments that support business investment at the Villeneuve Airport.
- For 2023, Sturgeon County is providing additional support through allocating staff time to assist with ground-side planning, coordinate a VIP / business showcase area, and access/traffic functions of the event.
- A traffic mitigation strategy has been created with the private Airshow operator and Edmonton Regional Airports Authority for 2023, including parking, ticket sales and enforcement.

External Communication

- The Airshow is subject to an annual review by Council, in public. Mr.
 Richard Skermer, President and CEO of Alberta International Airshow,
 made a public presentation at the October 25, 2022 Committee of the
 Whole with an update on planned activities for the 2023 Airshow.
- The Chief Administrative Officer has continued to engage Mr. Skermer, and regional partners including Government of Alberta ministries, the City of Edmonton, Edmonton Unlimited, and Explore Edmonton, to

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consider the appropriate sponsorship model for the Alberta International Airshow.

 For the event itself, Airshow organizers will communicate and market activities. Sturgeon County has previously used digital and social media to promote the event and has used direct marketing invitations to key stakeholders.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

Strategic Alignment

Planned Growth – Upgrades to parking lot infrastructure will contribute to traffic mitigation and allow the Airshow to be a successful event that showcases Sturgeon County as a hub of aviation activity and a centre for growth in the aviation and aerospace industries.

Collaborative Governance – Working with key partners to communicate and resolve issues and collaboratively partner to find solutions that are mutually beneficial and transparent.

Operational Excellence – Identifying mitigation measures and exploring solutions that are impactful and relevant that take an internally collaborative approach.

Organizational

- Support the private airshow operator to complete parking lot upgrades at the Villeneuve Airport by July 30, 2023.
- Execute Traffic Mitigation Strategy with Alberta International Airshow organizers and other external stakeholders.

Financial

 An additional \$70,000 contribution from the existing 2023 Operating Budget would be required.

Alternatives Considered

Council could decide not to approve funding for upgrades to the four approaches in the east parking lot for the 2023 Alberta International Airshow.

Implications of Alternatives

Strategic Alignment

If funding is not approved, it would impact the ability to execute the Traffic Mitigation Strategy.

Organizational

The Traffic Mitigation Strategy would need to be reviewed, and a new strategy would need to be prepared and executed.

Financial

Temporary approaches could be implemented but would be an ongoing year over year cost.

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Follow up Action 1. Execute Traffic Mitigation Strategy with Alberta International Airshow organizers and other external stakeholders (Transportation and Engineering Services, Summer 2023). 2.
