Proposed Motion	That Council approve the reallocation of up to \$65,000 from the Open Spaces capital project budget to the Casa Vista Pedestrian Bridge project in 2023.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council approve the reallocation from the 2024 to 2023 capital budget to complete the engineering work and detailed cost estimates to advance the pedestrian bridge construction in 2024.
