Request for Decision

Title	Contract Award - Carbondale Road Realignment
Proposed Motion	That Council award contract for the Carbondale Road Realignment (2023-068) project to TBL Construction Ltd. at a contract price of \$1,315,385.25 (excluding GST) and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the contract.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council award contract for the Carbondale Road Realignment (2023-068) project to TBL Construction Ltd. as the lowest compliant bidder.
Previous Council / Committee Direction	December 13, 2022 Regular Council Meeting Motion 482/22: That Council approve the 2023-2025 Capital Budgets in the amounts of \$35,701,907 for 2023, \$42,114,975 for 2024, and \$38,639,232 for 2025 as referenced in Attachment 3: Capital Funding and Project Listing.
Report	 Background Information The 2023 Carbondale Road Realignment contract consists of: Realignment of Carbondale Road (Township Road 552) from 250m west of Range Road 244 to approximately 650m east of the intersection. The scope of work includes 900m of drainage channel construction, common excavation, channel excavation, subgrade preparation, culvert removal and installation, granular base course, and asphalt. External Communication Tender for the Carbondale Road Realignment project was posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection ("APC") on April 3, 2023, and closed on May 10, 2023. Seven (7) bids were received ranging from \$1,315,385.25 to \$2,366,406.28. After reviewing the received tenders, Administration recommends that Sturgeon County award the contract for the Carbondale Road Realignment project to TBL Construction Ltd. as the lowest compliant bidder.

Procurement Policy

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the APC.
- Purchases exceeding \$500,000 are to be ratified at the following Council Meeting.
- The Chief Administrative Officer is the signing authority for all construction or capital contracts over \$500,000.

Implication of Administrative Recommendation

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Alternatives Considered

Organizational:

 By not awarding the contract, Sturgeon County would be required to continue intensive maintenance requiring further resources to maintain an acceptable level of service.

Financial:

 Not awarding this contract would only temporarily defer the required capital renewal cost for these assets.
