Title	Contract Award - Villeneuve Hamlet Drainage Improvement Project
Proposed Motion	That Council award the contract for the Villeneuve Hamlet Drainage Improvement project to Ideal Earthworks Inc. at a contract price of \$614,960.00 (excluding GST) and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the contract.
Administrative Recommendation	Administration recommends that Council award the contract for the Villeneuve Hamlet Drainage Improvement project to Ideal Earthworks Inc., as the lowest compliant bidder and reference checks.

Report	 Background Information The Villeneuve Hamlet drainage improvement project focuses on relieving the legacy flooding issues for the northern portion of the Villeneuve Hamlet located along Range Road 265 and west of Highway 44 (see Attachment 1). The site is noted as a spring flood location, due to the main runoff from the agricultural lands to the west, the low infrastructure elevations of the hamlet, and degrading infrastructure.
	• The Villeneuve Hamlet Drainage Improvement project consists of 22 culvert replacements, 1.46km of ditching, and the construction of a 390-meter berm.
	The project will be integrated into the future downstream improvements for the Villeneuve Drainage Channel.
	 Project limits entail the northern portion of the Hamlet of Villeneuve on the west side of Highway 44 including Ferland Drive and 475 meters along Range Road 265.
	External Communication
	 Tendering Tenders for the Villeneuve Hamlet Drainage Improvement project were posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection ("APC") and Bids and Tenders

on May 19, 2023, and closed on June 9, 2023.

- Six (6) bids were received, ranging from \$614,960.00 to \$1,296,188.50 (excluding GST) (see Attachment 2).
- Administration reviewed the received tenders for compliance with the tender specifications.
- A clarification meeting was held with the recommended compliant bidder on June 14, 2023.

Communications

- Notification has been delivered to all affected residents.
- There will be ongoing communication from the project designate to residents throughout construction.
- Construction communication guidelines have been developed for contractor to provide hand delivered letters to affected residents during individual lot impact phases of the project.

Relevant Policy/Legislation/Practices:

Procurement Policy

- Invitation to Tender is identified as the acceptable method of procurement for construction contracts and other high value procurements.
- Sturgeon County's standard for communicating competitive procurement opportunities is through the APC.
- Purchases exceeding \$500,000 are to be ratified at the following Council Meeting.
- The Chief Administrative Officer is the signing authority for all construction or capital contracts over \$500,000.
