Request for Decision

Title

Active Transportation Fund – Infrastructure and Communities Contribution Agreement – New Shared-Use Pathway and Pedestrian Bridge

Proposed Motion

That Council authorize the execution of the Contribution Agreement between Sturgeon County and the Government of Canada under the Active Transportation Fund for a new shared-use pathway and pedestrian bridge as provided in Attachment 2.

Administrative Recommendation

Administration recommends that Council authorize the execution of the Contribution Agreement to a maximum of \$1,739,042 for the construction of a new shared-use pathway adjacent to Starkey Road and pedestrian bridge across the Sturgeon River.

Report

Background Information

- The Sturgeon Valley Trail System Path Forward study completed in 2021 reviewed the active transportation system in the Sturgeon Valley to identify existing network gaps and determine a future network to promote both recreational use and use for daily activities.
- The study conducted a connectivity assessment which identified a Sturgeon River pedestrian bridge crossing and the Starkey Road trail segment as priority projects.
- The Open Space 2022-2024 capital budget included \$2.7 million for the development of these two projects.
- To offset the capital costs for these projects, Administration applied to a new Infrastructure Canada Active Transportation Fund in March 2022 for a contribution of up to 60 percent of the total project cost.
- On December 22, 2022, the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Infrastructure and Communities notified Sturgeon County of the approval in principle for the application with the project to be completed by March 31, 2026, as provided in Attachment 1.

 Administration has reviewed the Federal Contribution Agreement, provided as Attachment 2, and is recommending that Council authorize the execution of the Agreement, which provides for a maximum contribution from the Government of Canada of \$1,739,042 for the construction of a new shared-use pathway adjacent to Starkey Road and pedestrian bridge across the Sturgeon River.
