Vision

To construct or acquire a facility, approximately 50,000 square feet, to display over 60 military vehicles that cover the past 80 years of history that are currently held by members of the Valour Park Association. The association plans to acquire decommissioned military equipment and accessories for restoration and display; incorporation of volunteer programs and employment programs open to the general public to repair and refurbish military equipment and accessories for display and educational purposes, for the better understanding of the general public. Through the development, administration of a facility to display military equipment and accessories, for organized events, public viewings and to facilitate access to information. Through the development, and to support other nonprofit organizations with similar qualified charitable objectives.

- To collect, preserve and display vehicles and artifacts and archival materials related to the history of the Canadian Armed Forces
- To make these vehicles and artifacts and archival materials available to the public for historical research and through public exhibition.

- To provide other services to the public in support of our mission such as group tours, youth programs, educational kits, special events and research assistance.
- To maintain a museum for the purpose of carrying out the above objectives.
- To do all such things as are necessary or incidental to carrying out the above objects.




Generic Building Design

The Total Budget Estimate:


50,000 square foot free standing building (\$160 per square foot)

Partnerships and Funding

Provincial Level

- Heritage Preservation Partnership Program through Alberta Culture, Multiculturalism and Status of Women,
 - Up \$100,000 annually
- Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP)
 - Up to \$1M in the large Funding Stream
 - \$125,000 Annually
- Community Initiatives Program (CIP)
 - Up to \$75,000
- Cultural Industries Organization Project Grant through Alberta Foundation for the Arts)
 - Up to \$20,000 for display design and artwork

Partnerships and Funding

Continued

Federal Level

- Canada Cultural Spaces Fund,
 - 50% of Eligible costs (past funding up to \$1,000,000)
- Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program – Community, Culture and Recreation
 - \$33% of costs
- Organization of Military Museums of Canada
 - No limit Project based, nonrecurring.
