### **Request for Decision**

### **Subregional Negotiating Committee Member Appointments** 1. That Council revise the membership of the Intermunicipal Negotiating **Proposed Motion** Task Force to include Mayor Hnatiw, Deputy Mayor Stang, and Councillor Toms. 2. That Council appoint Mayor Hnatiw, Deputy Mayor Stang, and Councillor Toms to the Sturgeon County – Town of Legal Intermunicipal Committee. Administrative Administration recommends that Council authorize the appointment of Recommendation Mayor Hnatiw, Deputy Mayor Stang, and Councillor Toms to the Intermunicipal Negotiating Task Force and the Sturgeon County – Town of Legal Intermunicipal Committee. Previous Council / March 23, 2021 Regular Council Meeting Committee Motion 173/21: That Council approve the attached Recreation Cost Sharing Direction Agreement between Sturgeon County and the Town of Legal from funding received under the 2021 Significant Growth Revenue Policy - Community Building Priority and direct the Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer to execute the Agreement on behalf of Sturgeon County. Motion 162/21: That Council give third reading of Bylaw 1542/21 (Sturgeon County – Town of Legal Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework). July 9, 2018 Regular Council Meeting Motion 211/18: That Council approve the Intermunicipal Negotiating Task Force Terms of Reference as presented. Report **Background Information Intermunicipal Negotiating Task Force** The Intermunicipal Negotiating Task Force (INTF) was established in 2018 with the purpose of considering matters related to Intermunicipal Collaboration Frameworks (ICFs) and Intermunicipal Development Plans (IDPs) between Sturgeon County and its neighbouring municipalities, to share information, and to provide specific direction to the negotiators. The INTF consists of 3 Sturgeon County Council members. At the October 24, 2023 Council Organizational Meeting, Council appointed

Mayor Hnatiw, Councillor McLennan, and Councillor Toms to the INTF.

As the near-term focus of the INTF includes negotiations with the Town
of Legal, and in accordance with the Board and Committee
Appointments Policy, Mayor Hnatiw recommends that the INTF
membership be revised to remove Councillor McLennan and add Deputy
Mayor Stang.

#### Sturgeon County – Town of Legal Intermunicipal Committee

- Sturgeon County and the Town of Legal have had an Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICF) in place since 2021 (see Attachment 1).
- The Town of Legal recently triggered a process detailed in the Sturgeon County – Town of Legal ICF to request capital funding for the Town's arena and curling rink modernization project.
- The funding request process is outlined in the ICF (under Section 6), which involves setting up an Intermunicipal Committee (IC). The IC, a council committee, is responsible for evaluating steps to determine funding eligibility using a "gated approach".
  - Membership of the IC includes three members from each municipal council.
  - The IC convenes as needed to formulate recommendations. However, ultimate decisions regarding strategic direction, cooperative efforts impacting the municipal partners, and outcomes of the gated approach process are made by the respective Councils.
  - Meetings of the IC can be called by either municipality through written request, advising the reason for the meeting and providing options for meeting dates.
- In accordance with the Board and Committee Appointments Policy, Mayor Hnatiw has recommended that she, Deputy Mayor Stang, and Councillor Toms be appointed to the IC.
  - Deputy Mayor Stang is the area Councillor and has considerable knowledge and experience with the Town of Legal.
  - Mayor Hnatiw and Councillor Toms have participated in the past negotiations related to the ICF and recreation service agreements.
  - All three recommended Council members also recently participated in an information session related to the Legal arena and curling rink modernization project.
- Now that Sturgeon County has received written notification that the Town of Legal wishes to trigger the gated approach, an IC meeting must be held within 90 calendar days of their letter being received (i.e., by mid-May 2024).

• Sturgeon County and the Town of Legal currently have a recreation service agreement in place until December 31, 2025.

#### Intermunicipal Collaboration Frameworks (ICF)

- In accordance with Part 17.2 of the Municipal Government Act, Sturgeon County must have ICFs in place with each of its neighbouring municipalities (exception: ICFs are not required with municipalities that are in the same Growth Management Board, like the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board). The County has 10active ICFs.
- ICFs reinforce existing collaboration and formalize a process for municipalities to work together.
