




River Lot 8, Lamoureux Settlement,
'between Range Road 223[a] and the high
water mark of the North Saskatchewan
River'

- Designated in 1923.
- The site is composed of two late-18th century forts: Fort Augustus, established by the North West Company from 1794 to 1795, and Fort Edmonton, established by the Hudson's Bay Company in 1795; significant until 1801.
 - Primarily an archeological resource: the built form has long since disappeared from the landscape.
