Re: Alberta Community Partnership (ACP) Grant Application, and Update on the North Saskatchewan Heritage River Initiative under the Canadian Heritage Rivers System (CHRS)

I am pleased to provide an update on our collaborative initiative to see 718-kilometers of the North Saskatchewan (kisiskâciwani-sîpiy, omaka-ty) designated as a Heritage River under the Canadian Heritage Rivers System (CHRS) for which your municipality has provided a letter of support.

BRIEFING NOTE

CANADIAN HERITAGE RIVERS SYSTEM (CHRS)

- Established in 1984, the CHRS is a national collaboration among the provincial, territorial, and federal governments, and local communities, currently encompassing forty rivers from coast-to-coast (including 50km of North Sask. within Banff National Park).
- Alberta joined the CHRS in 1994 under then-premier and former Environment Minister Ralph Klein.
- Designation is commemorative, meaning that it doesn't affect any jurisdiction, ownership, or traditional
 or treaty rights along the river, nor does it create additional red-tape, regulations, or restrictions.
- CHRS is a vehicle for education and empowerment for residents and visitors to share in and support the storytelling of this life-sustaining element of our landscape, with specific focus on the river's cultural, biophysical, and recreational values and features.

NORTH SASKATCHEWAN HERITAGE RIVER INITIATIVE

- This Initiative is centered on supporting sustainable adventure/ecological, cultural, and heritage tourism both through strengthening existing, and establishing new, relationships and recreation planning.
- CHRS designation will contribute to knowledge development, facilitate partnerships and collaborative planning, increased public awareness, stewardship and conservation, and reconciliation.
- The NSR flows across Treaty 6 Territory, which reflects the treaty promise of "...as long as the river flows...". It is imperative we better understand and respect Indigenous perspectives and traditional knowledge in relation to the NSR.

Our efforts are supported by 15 of 16 North Sask. river-adjacent municipalities, and dozens of other
entities such as Confederacy of Treaty 6 First Nations, Métis Nation of Alberta, EPCOR, Fort Edmonton,
Explore Edmonton, Travel Alberta, River Valley Alliance, and North Sask. Watershed Alliance (NSWA),
among others.

NEXT STEPS & CALLS TO ACTION

- Smoky Lake County presented the formal 'Nomination Document' to the CHRS Board on November 24, 2021, where it, which was accepted then, and has now been recommended to the Minister of Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP) Jason Nixon.
 - In the coming weeks, as you have any meetings with the Minister and/or your local MLA, please consider reiterating your support for this initiative, and the potential positive ramifications for our local economies.
- The last step before designation will then be for project partners to work on and complete a river study, aka a non-statutory 10-year management plan. The intent of this work is to support environmental stewardship, grow the tourism/visitor economy, improve community wellness and recreation, and contribute to Reconciliation.
 - This river study may be modeled after <u>similar work recently undertaken on the Peace River</u>, led by the MD of Fairview on behalf of the Peace Valley Conservation, Recreation, and Tourism Society (PVCRTS) in 2020, including establishing a strategic vision, tour routes/itineraries, and creation of an interpretive plan.
 - The Village of Vilna has kindly put forward an application to the Alberta Community Partnership (ACP) Grant, for which we are asking that your Council consider adopting a resolution of support, as a project partner.
 - We are also working with other orders of government and Industry partners to secure additional funding for this work.

CONCLUSION

Smoky Lake County will be following up to share specific information about the next steps of the
management planning process, and the ways that the city and members of the public can contribute to
and have input on this project.





What is the Canadian Heritage Rivers System (CHRS)?

- <u>National</u> program comprised of the federal government, provinces, territories, and local communities, established in 1984
- Recognizes 40 Rivers across Canada
- Alberta joined in 1994 under Premier Ralph Klein
- Non-legislative, meaning CHRS doesn't create new regulations, red tape, nor affect ownership, jurisdiction, traditional rights, uses, etc.!
- Method for communicating stories, tourism, place-making, community wellness, stewardship, etc., to residents and visitors!




Metis Crossing files and Smoky Lake's Victoria District Economic Development Strategy




Process & Engagement

Most of the people surveyed [87%] supported the nomination of the North Saskatchewan River to the Heritage River System.

Those that opposed the nomination [9%] felt that no change was needed or that a designation to the [CHRS] would eventually result in restricted access to the river.

From what we heard, there is a yearning to learn more about the Indigenous peoples' history and culture along the river.

It is clear from the responses received that the North Saskatchewan River matters to Canadians. It is an icon of Western Canada's identity."











Why should the NSR across Alberta be designated?

Further to the 2010 Gap Analysis, the Nomination of the NSR in Alberta will provide necessary additional representation of:

- The Prairie and Boreal Plains Terrestrial Ecozones
- Rare Fish, including Lake Sturgeon (Nameo)
- Cultural elements including Human Consumption, Interprovincial-Territorial Boundaries, Collection of Shellfish, and Land-based touring
- Representing a 718-kilometer segment of a 1,287-kilometre transportation corridor, the 12th longest river in Canada, flowing across three Provinces, to Lake Winnipeg, and onto Hudson's Bay and the Atlantic Ocean, facilitating a wide range of early commercial activities and land-based touring.
- A legacy of First Nations and Métis cultures to the region as evidenced in the numerous riverside archaeological and spiritual sites dating from time immemorial.
- A major historic trade and travel route to the heart of North America.
- A strong wildlife environment that continues today to support harvesting practices of Indigenous peoples, as it also supported their ancestors.




